



Patient involvement for whose sake?

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Objectives

To involve patients actively in their own haemodialysis treatment to the extent they wish to and are able to be involved.





Intervention

Practical skills

include patients in development of instructions etc.

Systematic use of dokumentation

- make bed
- wash arm + hand desincektion
- get needles ready etc.
- insert card
- type in ultrafiltration
- take blood pressure
- read the screen
- deactivate the alarms
- tube the machine
- Guide the nurse when cannulating

Results

Interview after 2 years "I do it to help the nurse"

Questionnaire after 3 years "I like that my brain get activated"





Implications for practice

- Necessary to involve patients systematically in how they wish to be involved
- New way of interaction between patients and nurses
- Nurse a facilitator and educator rather than a caregiver
- Implicates changes in workflow and incorporation of new routines
